






Space Needle Wind Turbine Height Comparison






2020 POPULATION AT 6 MILES

-Horse Heaven Population - Existing Projects Benton - Total All Other State Wind Projects - Avg All Other State Wind Projects



Legal Strategy – Stay in the Game and Fight to the End

1. We are following the example set by Whistling Ridge.

- The judge removed turbines from the project because of the visual impact on people.
- We hired the same attorney and the same visual expert.
- Added a national wind project siting expert and the Benton PUD General Manager.
- And we now get to bring in more witness testimony on firefighting.

2. As in Whistling Ridge, if enough turbines are eliminated from consideration, the project may never be built.

3. The issues are wildlife & cultural (Yakama Nation), visual and economics, and firefighting. (TCC and BC).

4. We are the only public intervenor.

- No one else has standing to sue except Benton County and the Yakama Nation and TCC.
- 5. We can file suit to the Washington Supreme Court after the Governor makes his decision.

Bottom line: We fight till the end. If we stop, they win everything.

The ALJ's Hurdle – TCC's Ability to Speak for the Community at Large

In Judge Torem's Preliminary Hearing Order # 2 Order states:

"Any party wishing to present witness(es) on "Local Concerns, Attitudes and Opinions" should <u>justify the witness</u>' <u>significance as a representative of the local area and ability to speak for the community-at-large</u> and understand they will be subject to cross-examination. This category is not public comment that will be heard per RCW 80.50.090(4)."

The State of Washington Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council (EFSEC or Council) provides a "one-stop" siting process for major energy facilities in the State of Washington. EFSEC coordinates evaluation and licensing steps for siting certain energy facilities in Washington. EFSEC specifies the conditions of construction and operation. If approved, a Site Certification Agreement is issue in lieu of any other individual state or local agency permits. EFSEC also manages an environmental and safety oversight program of facility and site operations.





Thompson Hill Residences South Facing Viewshed 499 ft hub height
















Fire Fighting Map & Guidance from Benton County





